- 7. This trust fund is designed to run indefinitely. Arrangements would be made for dispersal of trust fund sometime in the future if such dispersal was ever deemed necessary.

Three scholarships worth a total of \$6,000 were awarded this year by the Lambton International Plowing Match '91 Trust Fund. The scholarships were made possible from the over \$125,000 profit Lambton Organizers earned by hosting the 1991 International Plowing Match and Farm Machinery Show in Enniskillen Township.

The money was invested and this year it generated three awards of \$2,000 each.

All candidates must be enrolled in their second year of college or university to qualify for the awards which are based on community involvement, academic record, and financial need.
